

## COURSE STRUCTURE

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level 1 Formation (Part A) is a week-long, residential formation experience introducing participants to the spiritual life of the child ages 3–6 and the foundations of the CGS method. Rooted in Scripture, liturgy, prayer, and careful observation of the child, this intensive course combines presentations, hands-on work with materials, personal reflection, and communal prayer.

Participants live on-site for the duration of the course, with overnight accommodations and all meals provided, creating a contemplative and communal environment that supports deep learning and spiritual growth. This formation is ideal for catechists, clergy, religious, parents, teachers, and others discerning a call to serve young children through CGS.
